Eat healthily



Control your body weight



Stay active

Try to breastfeed for at least six months

BREAST CANCER: MYTHS V. FACTS

MYTHS

Finding a lump in your breast means you have breast cancer

Breast cancer is an infectious disease

Breast cancer only occurs in women

Breast cancer only occurs in women who have family history

Mammograms cause breast cancer

FACTS

Actually **80%** of these lumps are non-cancerous

Breast cancer is a **non-communicable** disease

Approximately 1% of breast cancer occurs in men

Family history is only one of the risk factors

Although exposure to radiation is a risk factor, the amount of radiation emitted during the mammogram is **quite low** in comparison to other diagnostic tools

Surgery



Chemotherapy



Radiation



Hormone therapy



Targeted therapy
